The purpose of Climate Action Week was to raise awareness about the actions we can take in our local community and as Global Citizens in order to slow down Climate Change. Events organised included our Battery Recycling Competition, our Walk on Wednesday competition and a Litter and Waste Assembly hosted by a representative from Thorntons Waste.
